FOR YOUR SAFETY

Regardless of how you enjoy your snow sports, always show courtesy to others and be aware that THERE ARE INHERENT RISKS in all snow recreation activities. These risks include rapid changes in weather and surface conditions, collisions with others as well as natural and artificial hazards such as rocks, trees stumps, bare spots, lift towers and snowmaking equipment. Common sense and personal awareness can reduce such risks. Observe the code below and share with others the responsibility for a great experience.

1. Know your ability and always stay in control.
2. Take lessons from qualified professional instructors to learn and progress.
3. As you proceed downhill or overtake another person, you must avoid people below and beside you.
4. Do not stop where you could obstruct a trail, a run or are not visible from above.
5. When entering a trail, a run or starting downhill, look uphill and give way to others.
6. Always use chairlift restraining devices where provided and always use proper devices to prevent runaway equipment.
7. Ensure equipment is in good condition.
8. Observe and obey all signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails or runs and keep out of closed areas.
9. Before using any lift you must have the knowledge and ability of how to get on and off safely.
10. Do not ski, snowboard, ride a lift or undertake any other alpine activity if your ability is impaired by drugs or alcohol.
11. If you are involved in, or witness an accident, alert Ski Patrol, remain at the scene and identify yourself to Ski patrol.

Know the code: It's your responsibility

NISEKO RULE

Those who wish to ski outside of the controlled areas must follow the Niseko Rules. Niseko Rules are posted at entrances to controlled areas and at lift stations. Also, flyers indicating the rules are handed out at ticket offices and information centers.
